Art competition for primary and secondary schools in east Kent

At Pilgrims we know that everyone is different, and when we are caring for patients across east Kent, we try to find out what is important to them as individuals so that we give the advice, care and support that is right for them. With this in mind, we would like children across the region to think about what makes them special and to create a work of art which expresses their individuality - what makes them unique.

Entries will be exhibited in The Front Room at The Beaney in Canterbury from 21st March – 17th May 2020. The exhibition will be seen by well over 10,000 visitors. The winners and runners-up, together with their teachers and families, will be invited to a prize giving ceremony at The Beaney. Winners will be chosen by a judging panel with an additional 'People's vote' prize, as chosen by the public who visit the exhibition. All prize winners will receive a framed certificate, and their school will win a selection of art materials.

The competition is open to children from Year 3 to Year 13, with prizes for three age groups: Years 3-6; Years 7-11; Years 12-13. All artwork must be original and created by the named child.

## **Full Terms and Conditions**

This competition is only open to the pupils of schools in east Kent.

We will exhibit as many entries as possible, however, we cannot guarantee that all entries will be exhibited.

We would like to encourage as many entries as possible in a variety of sizes and media. Artwork needs to be a minimum of A4 and a maximum of A2 including framing.

All entries must be 2D artwork/photography and ready to hang - either framed or a box canvas, both with mirror plates already attached. Artwork not ready to hang this way will not be included in the exhibition.

All schools may enter up to 10 submissions in each of the three age groups.

All artwork must have the name, year group, title of the piece, medium and school name on the reverse, with an entry form attached. All artwork must have been made in the previous or current academic year.

The judges' decision is final.

Pilgrims Hospices and The Beaney will handle artwork with the utmost care. However, neither organisation takes responsibility for any damage caused to artwork.
