Your Library Service

Library and Knowledge Services are here to support all healthcare staff and students by providing the best evidence, information, and resources to support clinical decision making, research, and lifelong development.

We are open to all staff and students within the Trust, as well as other local NHS Trusts and organisations. We have an Education Library at each of the three acute hospitals: Canterbury, Ashford, and Margate.

Opening hours

All three of our Libraries are staffed:

Monday - Friday, 09.00 - 17.00

24-Hour Access is available. Ask your site library and we will issue a keyfob to your library account. Staff based at Ashford also have the option of enabling their SmartCard to access the library there.

How to join

To join, you will need to complete our online membership form here: **tinyurl.com/ekhuft-libraryreg**. Membership is free to all staff and students within the following organisations and institutions:

(Please note that access with an OpenAthens account to our online resources is only available for staff and students employed by East Kent Hospitals Trust. We can however still supply you with requested content from our resources, if you work for another organisation.)

Patient access

Patients are welcome to come in to the Libraries as well - we can help you access general information on conditions, and advise you on relevant books for use within the library.

Catalogue and Library Account

After registering, you will receive a confirmation email containing your Library account User ID and PIN. Use this to log in to your account to manage your book loans, and search our catalogue for books and journals.

OpenAthens accounts

To access the majority of the online resources we have access to, you will need to sign up for a free OpenAthens account. This is a single-sign-on account that grants secure access to our journals, ebooks, and evidence databases. You can register for an account here:

Please note that locally-funded resources may vary depending on which NHS organisation you belong to. Log in to your account at **www.openathens.net** to see a full list of resources available to you.

Library facilities

Each library has open computer access, printing, scanning, and photocopying facilities, free WiFi, and quiet study areas.

We have open access PCs at each library. Log in with your EKHUFT Active Directory account or SmartCard. If you are not an EKHUFT staff member, there is an option to log in automatically for basic internet and Word access. Please ask in your library for more details.

- Staff can print, photocopy, and scan to email using the Trust-wide SafeCom system.
- Each library has access to the free Trust-wide WiFi network, as follows:

Network ID: **EK-Hospital-Free-Internet** Password: **hospital**

• There are areas designated for quiet study at each library.

Books

All three libraries hold an extensive range of books covering medicine, nursing, education, management, science, and other healthcare related areas.

Your membership works across all three libraries, so you can borrow and request books from other sites. In addition to this, you can also request books from our wider regional network of healthcare libraries across Kent, Surrey, and Sussex.

Book loans

- You can borrow up to 10 books at a time.
- Books can be borrowed for 28 days.
- You can renew books twice, provided they have not been reserved (you can renew by logging in to your library account, or by contacting us).
- We do not charge late fees for overdue books.
- Books cannot be borrowed outside staffed hours.
- Books can be returned to any of the three libraries, either in person, via our Book Return Boxes at each library, or via internal post.

All books are the responsibility of the borrower, and the cost of replacement, plus a £10 administration fee, will be charged in the event of loss, damage, or non-return after a period of six months of inactivity after the due date.

Inter-library loans

If we do not hold a particular book you are looking for, let us know and we can usually get hold of it from another library in our network for you to borrow. You can also fill out a blue Book Request card found at your Library's front desk.

Ebooks

We also have access to hundreds of healthcare ebooks online. These are free to view online, and some books feature the option to download chapters as PDFs.

Articles and evidence online

We have access to thousands of full-text journals online. The best way to search for articles is on the new **Knowledge and Library Hub**.

Search results will show whether we stock the journal, and the relevant website links will be displayed with it. If it forms part of our access subscriptions, you will be prompted to enter your OpenAthens credentials.

Search journals by specialty

Alternatively you can browse which journals are available in your specialty with our own Resources by Specialty webpages. See page 5 for more details).

Requesting an article

If you cannot gain access to a journal to read an article, let us know and we can usually get hold of it from another library in our network for you. Email, call, or ask in your library with the article references to hand.

All article requests are free, unless we have to request it from the British Library as a last resort, at a charge of £6 per article.

Journals in print

Each library keeps a wide range of medical, nursing, scientific, and healthcare journals in their print archives. Searching our catalogue will show which libraries hold a certain journal and whether it is online or in print. Each library also keeps a printed list of journal holdings at the front desk.

Articles can be photocopied and scanned to email, but journals cannot be issued on loan, and are reserved for reference use only within the libraries.

Copyright notice

You should be aware of your legal copyright responsibilities when using a photocopier, scanner, or downloading articles from the internet. Copies may only be used for research and private study, and for noncommercial use.

There are notices beside our photocopiers which provide more information on copyright restrictions. If you have any questions regarding copyright, please ask library staff.

Our Clinical Librarians work closely with clinicians and their departments, attending clinical meetings, medical decision meetings, educational ward rounds, as well as department journal clubs.

We help inform patient care by bringing knowledge and current evidence direct to the clinician, both in clinical meetings and at the bedside.

Skills training

We support individual staff, teams, and departments with training in evidence searching, critical appraisal, reflective writing, and understanding statistics, all of which can enhance the delivery of services and support professional academic development.

We also deliver skills training and resource awareness across East Kent to staff in their own surgeries and practices, as part of our primary care outreach service.
