Welcome from our Director of Income Generation and Marketing.

Thank you for your interest in working with Pilgrims Hospices as part of the Income Generation Team.

At Pilgrims Hospices we have a simple Vision:

"of a community where people with a life limiting illness and their family and friends are supported and empowered to live well in mind and body until the very last moment of their life."

At its heart, Pilgrims Hospices is dedicated to ensuring people living with a terminal illness can access the quality care and comfort they deserve. Our work began more than 40 years ago from our Canterbury site, which remains as our Head Office. We now operate from three hospice sites; Canterbury, Thanet and Ashford, our community nursing team provide care in people's own homes, together with our Hospice at Home teams, Therapy & Wellbeing support, and Psychosocial and Bereavement Care.

It costs in excess of £15 million to fund our series; our diligent and dynamic Income Generation Team raise over £12 million each year and combined with an annual grant from the NHS we are able to provide our end-of-life care services free of charge. We are only able to give our specialist care to local people thanks to the generosity of our east Kent community.

This is an exciting time to join us; the team have won charity sector awards over three consecutive years for innovation and technology; both on a national and local scale. The team are creative, dynamic and passionate. They are dedicated to raising funds and delivering an engaging portfolio of community fundraising, events, challenges, in-memory and legacy fundraising, developing corporate partnerships and delivering creative campaigns and initiatives for Pilgrims supporters to get involved in.

Being part of Team Pilgrims and contributing to our mission is a truly satisfying experience and we thank you for your interest in joining us to raise exceptional funds to enable the charity to deliver the continued end-of-life care and support to the east Kent community.

We couldn't do any of this without you.






Pilgrims Hospice is a charity that has provided end-of-life care and support to individuals and families across east Kent for over 40 years. Our mission is to make a meaningful difference in the lives of those facing life-limiting illnesses by providing compassionate care and support during their final days.

We offer a full range of services, including Wellbeing and bereavement support, symptom management, and practical assistance, to anyone in east Kent with a life-limiting condition.

Our services are FREE of charge, and with only 20-25% of our funding coming from the government, we need to rely heavily on the generosity of people from our local community.



*Our funding in 2021-22 includes a £4,000.000 donation which sits in a designated fund towards our planned capital appeal for building a new hospice.

Pilgrims Therapy Centres:

At each of our sites, our Wellbeing Practitioners and expert multidisciplinary team offer a wide range of practical and emotional support to patients and carers through the Pilgrims Wellbeing Programme. Visit pilgrimshospices.org/wellbeing to find out more.



Care in the community:

We care for many of our patients at home, supporting them to remain in the comfort of their own home wherever possible. Our expert community nursing and Hospice at Home care teams can offer the right support at the right time, making a difference until the very last moment of life.



In-patient units at Ashford, Canterbury and Thanet:

Some patients come to the hospice for a short stay to better manage their pain and symptoms, before returning home and receiving support from our community nursing team. An admission may also be offered to provide compassionate and dignified care and support in the last few days of life.



Bereavement support:

Grief is a natural and normal response to death.

We offer 1-to-1 bereavement support for those who have lost a loved one with us, but our Stepping Stones groups help those who have been bereaved to share experiences and understand the feelings associated with grieving, regardless of a connection to Pilgrims.

Introducing the Income Generation Department

Pilgrims Hospices Income Generation is split into distinct and specialist teams, who support the east Kent community to raise funds in many different ways. Our focus is to put the donor at the heart of Pilgrims' supporter care. To ensure that everyone receives the best possible stewardship and are progressed through a range of giving opportunities.



Community Fundraising:

Our Community Fundraising Team help to cultivate and motivate supporters with their own fundraising to ensure their full potential is achieved within each hospice catchment area. This team is responsible for all local fundraising activities – they deliver talks, oversee collections and pots, engage schools and oversee youth fundraising activities, they lead 'on behalf of' groups fundraising, and deliver many community events. They support third party fundraisers or 'do it yourself fundraisers' with lots of creative ideas, tips and guidance. Whether hosting a community activity such as a bake or clothes sale, creating a local fair or raffle, donating for a Dress Down Day, or playing in a charity match or another sporting activity. Our community fundraising teams also lead and deliver fantastic local community events; such as the Thanet 5k Colour Run, art events, Summer and Christmas Fairs, Christmas Tree Recycling and various other much-loved local events.



Events, Challenges and Digital Fundraising:

The Events Fundraising Team lead on the delivery of Pilgrims Hospices extensive events portfolio; it's digital innovations and creative fundraising products. The Events Team raise circa £400K+, alongside leading the fundraising digital



communications. Pilgrims Hospices portfolio of events is diverse and extensive with; x3 high value hospice-wide events with in excess of 2,500 participants, 20+ challenge events and digital solutions. Pilgrims supporters have a diverse range of events and challenges to choose from; whether a cyclist, runner, walker, novice sports person or someone looking for a bucket list event such as a Wing Walk or Skydive, there is something for everyone. Individual Giving (In Memory Donations and Regular Giving)

In Memory Fundraising is delivered by our Individual Giving Team and is often the foundation to a donors' initial wishes to support the charity. Our Individual Giving Team lead on individual donations that are directly linked to Pilgrims' clinical care. There are many ways a donor may want to remember and celebrate their loved one, whilst supporting the work of Pilgrims Hospices.

Supporters can celebrate a loved one's life at our two annual remembrances; Trees of Love in December or Sunflower Memories in July, dedicate a leaf or dove on the Memory Trees or honour them with an AlwaysLoved Tribute Fund online.



Always Caring – Reliable, predictable income (regular giving) allows us to face the challenges ahead with confidence and plan for the future more effectively. Corporate and Trust Fundraising:

This team is a newly-created function within Pilgrims Income Generation and we're in an exciting period of development. This team lead on the delivery of Corporate and Trust Partnerships and are responsible for prospecting, stewardship and cultivation of mutually beneficial corporate and local business support opportunities. Additionally, the development of grant making trust supporters; generating sustainable unrestricted and restricted income within east Kent.



Lottery:

Pilgrims Hospices Lottery is a more than 22,000-strong community. Our Lottery Team are the local lottery that really does make a difference. Supporters can join our weekly draw for just £1 a week and be in with a chance of winning up to £20,000 – over 100 guaranteed prizes to be won every week! Summary of the role

Ashford Community Fundraising Officer (Part-time – 14 hours per week)

The role of the Community Fundraising Officer is to help support and develop Community Fundraising within the Ashford catchment area. Community Fundraising is integral to Pilgrims organisational engagement in east Kent and is a key objective to increase reach, deliver excellent supporter care, raise awareness at a local level; to nurture and drive income generation and to help support Pilgrims ambitions of community focussed giving.

The postholder will be responsible for helping to support local Community and Event Fundraising. The role will engage with local donors, community groups, schools, venues and 'on-behalf of' fundraising groups. As well as supporting those wishing to deliver their own 'in aid of' (third-party) activity and helping to support local community event activity.





Position in organisation:

Location: Ashford Hospice based. Working hours are flexible and could be delivered in 3 or 4 working days in the office setting. Flexibility of working days may be required during peak fundraising seasons.

Key responsibilities

Supporting local Community and Events Fundraising

- The Community Fundraising Officer will help to support the Manager to deliver local community fundraising activities to the highest standard; to support all events and community activities and ensure that they are well organised; working with external suppliers and other Pilgrims representatives to ensure events are safely controlled. Including supermarket, street and mass event collections, and coordinating schools and youth groups fundraising in aid of Pilgrims.
- This role is responsible for supporting local income generation activities such as community events, clubs, groups, store/venue pot collections, attending school assemblies and supporting the fundraising of young people.
- The postholder will assist with community activities and coordinate local hospice events, overseeing, recruitment and management or marshals/ volunteers, producing briefing materials and coordinating day management plans. Additionally, recording communications on the



Benefits Summary

Pilgrims Hospices is a great place to work, develop your career and feel engaged by delivering a role that makes a real difference in the east Kent communities we work in.

To help candidates make an informed choice when considering employment with us, we have summarised below our main benefits, and some of the smaller perks of working with us.



Salary

£9,602 (pro-rata). The salary for this role has been benchmarked against other charity sector roles within similar sized organisations. Pilgrims takes pride in the fact that you

are joining a dynamic, progressive and award winning organisation within the local charity sector. Pilgrims Income Generation Team will invest in our fundraisers' training and future development where possible and to enable advancements in future fundraising.



Occupational Pension Scheme

We operate a defined contribution group pension scheme and make an employer's contribution equivalent of 6% of gross pay into this scheme alongside an employee contribution equivalent of 2% from your pay.



Enhanced Maternity Pay

Pregnant employees who have worked for Pilgrims Hospices at least 12 months at the 15th week before the expected

week of childbirth, will be entitled to: 8 weeks' full pay, 18 weeks of half pay and 13 weeks at Statutory Maternity Pay.

*The 26 weeks of Enhanced Maternity Pay is inclusive of SMP



Life Insurance

Eligible employees after completing their probationary

period will be entitled to receive Life Insurance through Canada Life. This would mean in the unfortunate event of your death during service, nominated individual/s will receive 2x your annual salary.

- Free parking on site
- Subsidised meals (meals available from £1.65).



Occupational Sick Pay

Once a member of staff has been employed for 6 months, they are entitled to occupational sick pay at the follow rates:
